With demand growing for students with skills in computer science and programming, <u>Code.org</u> launched The Hour of Code. Timber Trace students will have Hour of Code activities in the months of December and January. We hope the challenge will spark students' interest in learning more about computer technology. Even if students don't intend on growing up to become computer programmers, advocates insist that learning code can help students succeed in a broad range of skills.

Girls and students of color are severely underrepresented in computer science. The Hour of Code provides a fun, engaging introduction to coding aimed at absolute programming beginners. Students of any age can get started by visiting <u>https://studio.code.org/</u> to begin coding tutorials. New this year are grade 2-5 tutorials based on the Disney movie Moana!

Grade K-2 students have not registered for The Hour of Code. Parents may do so if they wish.

Grade 3-5 students will use their 8-digit student ID number for both username and password to log into The Hour of Code after they register in Technology class.

Code.org is a non-profit dedicated to giving every student in every school the opportunity to learn computer science, and expanding participation of girls and students of color. Learn more at <u>www.Code.org</u>.

<u>i-Ready</u>

i-Ready supports instruction using engaging, contemporary animation; the lessons are challenging and interactive. i-Ready has two free apps available from i-Tunes. **Door 24 Plus** for grades 1-5. Door 24 Plus focuses on fact fluency and computational fluency. **World's Worst Pet** focuses on vocabulary development for fourth and fifth grade students.

Parents are encouraged to help their child(ren) memorize the student portal username and password. Students use the portal at mysdpbc.org to access district-approved learning resources.
